Christian Theater Finds New Home

There is a small community theater in Palmyra, New York that is proof that dreams do come true through prayer and God's timing.

Impact Theater has been operating in the Park and Club Rooms on Main Street since March 2001 under the direction of Frank Irace. It is a Christian theater for the arts that offers various local artists as well as live original drama in a comfortable off-broadway type atmosphere. Each month the large, sparse, impersonal room at 149 East Main Street is transformed into a theater complete with a stage, lights, sound, and tables with seating for 52 guests. It is a labor of love for the 10 or so regular, non-paid crew members that assemble and disassemble the theater monthly, as it is also for Irace.

Irace felt God calling him to minister to the community through drama. He began writing scripts and for about two years directed performances at local churches. After securing the room at the Park and Club Rooms for Friday nights, Impact Theater was born and began with an open-

ing night of all drama featuring the In Your Face Players. The theaters slogan "It's significant theater!" rang true that evening.

One Friday night each month the community can enjoy live theater for free. Local artists with such diverse styles such as Wales Road, known for Christian blues, and Brothers In Grace, a southern gospel quartet, have performed. There

has been dance and poetry and drama. Intermission includes homemade desserts and coffee and time to browse through the many free counseling materials available for those struggling or who know of someone struggling with a life circumstance. Many times the drama deals with social issues, from spousal abuse to alcoholism, and these materials are to help

minister.

The theater is operated and funded by Irace and his wife and donations from private individuals, churches and the audience.

With a fully booked schedule for 2002, the theater will

start the new year in a new home. Irace is anticipating the move to 1180 Canandaigua Rd.(Rt. 21), the Town of Palmyra Town Hall, to be a great opportunity for the theater to grow. With a permanent stage and lighting, a larger room and other amenities, the type of performances the theater can host will be broader.

With his debut CD I AM fresh out, the Impact Theater audience will be among the first in the area to hear his music live.
